
Islam or Quran is the second largest religion in the world. This religion is being followed by 1.6 billion people in 272 countries. Islam, also known as Muslim, has six main doctrines that are known as "art-e-aakhirat" which includes different rituals and practices for Muslims who follow Muhammad's teachings to get closer to Allah. The first doctrine of Islam is "Belief". To believe in the Oneness of God and his prophets, this means to believe in Muhammad's teachings. The other five doctrines are "Prayer", "Zakat", "Fasting", "Hajj", and finally "Jihad. The purpose of this article is to focus on belief and in particular the question: Is Muhammad the last prophet of God?. Although we will look at what Muhammad said about himself to see if he was a true prophet. Another well talked about subject in the Quran is, whether there is a god besides God or not?. The Quran further elaborates on this topic in many verses, well explained in the following lines to understand well. In terms of belief Prophet Muhammad (S) is mentioned as the last and the final messenger and source of guidance for humanity after prophets like Noah, Abraham, Ishmael, Isaac, Moses and Jesus Christ (Peace Be Upon Them). In a saying by Muhammad, "Upon no soul do I place a burden greater than that which I have placed upon myself", thus the teaching of Islam is centered around Muhammad's teachings and his judgment. However, there is no independence of views among Muslim scholars on this subject. The understanding that Muhammad was the last messenger and prophet is fundamental to Islam, this constitutes an integral part of Islamic belief system. This belief is based on many verses in the Quran and many hadith literature. This doctrine is known as "khatm-e-nabuwat" which means to believe in the finality and completion of prophethood. This doctrine requires all Muslims to follow Muhammad's teachings in order to get closer to Allah. Prophet Muhammad (S) presented himself as the last prophet to lead the way to righteousness, peace and salvation. He viewed himself as a perfect human being who conveyed God's final message for humanity. He did not claim to be "a complete god" or "the son of God". The Quran emphasizes that he did not claim divinity although other people did, thus distinguishing his status from that of Jesus. Prophet Muhammad (S) gave orders to other prophets in this verse, "But unto thee have I granted the Scripture with truth, confirming that which was before it, and a watcher over it. Hereafter shall there come unto you apostles (each) confirming the Scripture that is with you, and shall bring forth the revelation (thereof) as the truth and the truth shall confirm that which is with you." Qur'an 5:48. The Quran tells us that God gave revelations to other prophets before giving the final scriptures to Muhammad. The Quran confirms prophecies such as those found in Genesis, Isaiah, Psalms and others. This means all true prophets revealed to us God's divine message of oneness, peace, happiness and salvation. The Quran also states that all of them brought humanity back to God's path.
